Giving role in the Trinity, the holy spirit is the nurturer. She creates new insight and transforms the faithful into new life.

Jesus answered Nicodemus. I assure you unless someone is born in noon. It's not possible to seek God's kingdom. John chapter three, verse three, common English Bible.

Our biblical ancestors did not leave a description of the Holy Spirit. They recorded feelings. The spirit offered and signs of her good work among them.

Their metaphors are key to understanding how they perceive their experiences. For example, when to cannot be seen, but it's effects on the world around can be spiritual experiences are beyond the limits of human words to describe our biblical ancestors wanted to preserve their encounters with the spirit so that when the spirit spoke to us, we would know that was what they experienced as well.

One example of their use of metaphors to describe the Spirit's presence is the story of Pentecost from acts. The holy spirit made her presence known through a sudden rushing wind tongues of fire that rested on each of the believers who were gathered and the believers sudden ability to speak in many different languages.

The multiple languages that help others understand the good news was an affirmation of what the holy spirit could do. We two are encouraged to see the work of the holy spirit in us and in others.

The spirits of the Old Testament called the spirit of God. In the Old Testament, we recognize her role in several key stories in Genesis chapter one, verse two common English Bible, the reach or spirit of God blows like wind over the waters and begins to create the world.

The spirit creates suggested reading Genesis one verses one through five in Genesis chapter two, verse seven, God blows the breadth or spirit of life into the nostrils of the human creature.

The spirit animates life suggested reading Genesis chapter two verses one through eight in Isaiah chapter 61, verse one, the lighting of the Lord God's spirit on Isaiah is called annoying team.

She calls him charges him to bring good news to the poor, to bind up the broken hearted, to proclaim release to the captives and liberation for prisoners.

The spirit inspires heals, blesses freeze, redeems affirms all people and advocates for justice suggested reading Isaiah 61 verses one through four.

The spirit in the New Testament, Jesus refers to the spirit of God with a proper name in the new Testament.



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Holy spirit, who shows up in key stories of transformation in mark. One verse 10 in Jesus' baptism, the holy spirit descends like a dove from heaven.

She gives authority to his ministry, which she also gives to us in our baptisms suggested reading mark chapter one verses nine through 11 in acts chapter two verses one through four.

On the day of Pentecost. The holy spirit is described as a wind that enters the room, a flame above their heads, breath that fills not only their lungs, but their souls.

The words of praise in languages, other than their own to broaden the reach of the spirit and the experience of the believers.

The holy spirits is a communal experience affirmed by everyone present for themselves. And for each other suggested reading acts chapter two verses one through eight.

The spirit in the New Testament continued in Romans chapter eight, verse 26 in the new revised standard version. Paul reassures us that when we are unable to pray for ourselves, the spirit intercedes, her prayers are offered with sighs too deep.

For words, the holy spirit is our advocate before God. Our second advocate for Jesus was our first. She continually prays for us, suggested readings, Romans chapter eight, verses 26 and 27.

And first John two one in John 20 verses 21 and 22. And this account of the coming of the holy spirit, Jesus breathed the holy spirit into the disciples with his own breath.

The effect is peace in the hearts of those who believe it is a clear indication that the spirit is sent by God through Jesus Christ to be with us.
