DESCRIPTION

Children's books/literature refers to a wide range of genres that covers all material written and produced for the entertainment of children and/or young adults. Children's books (both secular or faith-based) can be incorporated into a lesson on any topic with any age group. This handout uses "I Can Pray with Jesus" as an engaging hook for ages 7-9.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR IN-PERSON TEACHING

- 1. Choose a book to open the lesson.
- 2. Determine what section(s) of the book to share.
- 3. Read the selection(s) out loud with the class as an introduction to the Lord's Prayer and be sure to share the photos so everyone can see

INSTRUCTIONS FOR VIRTUAL TEACHING

- 1. Choose a book to open the lesson.
- 2. Determine what section(s) of the book to share.
- 3. Take pictures to upload on slides so everyone can see (check out Understanding Fair Use in Education to make sure you are not breaking Copyright Law.)
- 4. Read the selection(s) out loud with the class as an introduction to the Lord's Prayer

IDEAS FOR USING THIS METHOD

- simplify a complex topic
- engaging hook at the beginning of a lesson
- refer back to the book during the lesson
- ask and encourage questions before/during/after reading
- can be read aloud by the teacher, student(s), or through a video
- utlize the songs and actions provided in the book
