DESCRIPTION

A Ted-Ed talk is a short 15-18 minute presentation on a topic of interest. This technique helps students learn to present engaging material, scaffold ideas with examples and use research source material

INSTRUCTIONS FOR IN-PERSON TEACHING

Discuss Ted-Ed talks, show example videos Show list of topics

Introduce sources materials (books, websites, etc.)

Have students pick topics

Have students work on presentations

Have students present presentations after a given time or on a future date

As students present topics, have discussions over topics

INSTRUCTIONS FOR VIRTUAL TEACHING

Discuss Ted-Ed talks, show examples over zoom or similar platform
Show list of topics
Show potential places online to find sources
Have students pick topics
Have students work on presentations
Have students present presentations on a date in future
As students present on topics, have discussions over topics
