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DESCRIPTION

Timelines are useful for students and teachers alike to compile information chronologically. The use of timelines is especially useful in considering growth and changes over time.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR IN-PERSON TEACHING

Timeline creation can be as simple or as complex as you care to make it. Students can be given the simple supplies of paper and pencil to create a timeline for a Bible story. You can also give students chart paper, oil pastels, paint, or other art mediums and have them write and illustrate the story chronologically. This is also a great way to talk about your student's individual faith stories.

Timelines are best used in instances where time, growth and change are being observed. Some good times to use this would be:

- During the telling of student's faith stories
- In retelling Bible stories
- When diving deep in scriptural passages to find themes, repetition and trends
